- Artist statement (maximum 200 words)
- Artistic Resume or Bio (maximum 200 words)
- Proposed use of residency time (maximum 300 words) This section should clearly state what the project is about and what you hope to achieve with it. Provide a detailed overview of the project, including the materials and techniques you plan to use. A realistic timeline.
- Work sample submissions: Limit of 10 images of recent work (past 5 years), in JPEG format, max resolution 1024x768, 300 dpi, with each JPEG not exceeding 3 MB. (May be submitted on a travel drive, or electronical by email)
- Document listing your work, samples with title, date, medium, and brief description.
- Past Publicity and/or Press (list any exhibitions or gallery shows you have been in) if applicable.
- Plans for workshop, artist talk, or presentation during the residency (maximum 300 words). Whether you would consider an exhibition within the next two years.
- Strategy for promoting your residency experience (maximum 200 words) (e.g., media, blogs, social media, artist talk, open studio, or art show)

Selection Criteria: Applications will be evaluated by a panel including gallery manager Nicole Chernish and others, based on:

1. Artistic Excellence

- Originality, innovation, vision, and imagination
- Artistic development and risk-taking
- Consistent body of work and proven merit
- The primary goal of eligible artists must be to generate new works or furthering of existing works, as opposed to remounting or re-interpreting existing works

2. Project Merit

- Integration of art into the community and the project's value
- Alignment with the artist's career goals and growth potential
- Feasibility and suitability for the residency space, Artists working with toxic materials, hazardous machinery, etc. will not be considered due to limitations within the building. Spray paint, welding, and epoxy resin are not permitted.
- Focus on underrepresented artists, art forms, and underserved locations. (Please feel free to elaborate on how you identify and how this may influence your application)
